<u>Fred Lund – LVW</u>: Mr. Lund commented with regard to a resolution that was previously passed regarding Sustainable Jersey. He felt that residents were not properly informed of our involvement and urged Council to reconsider this. In his opinion, this program is closely related to United Nations Agenda 21.

<u>Hank Glen – 29 Wycliffe Rd.</u>: Mr. Glen questioned bills for the affordable housing attorney. Ms. Zsoldos said the State is looking to take away affordable housing funds and Mr. Surenian can guide us through this.
