MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP MEETING MINUTES NOVEMBER 12, 2013

The meeting of the Manchester Township Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Council President Craig Wallis. The following statement was read by the Municipal Clerk:

"Adequate notice of this meeting was provided in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, pursuant to P.L. 1975, Chapter 231. Said notice was advertised in the Asbury Park Press, Star Ledger and was posted in the lobby of the Municipal Building."

The Clerk noted for the record that, also present were Business Administrator Elena Zsoldos, Township Attorney Steven Secare, Chief Financial Officer Diane Lapp and Township Auditors Andrew Zabiega and Joe Faccone.

<u>CORRESPONDENCE</u> – The Clerk read a memo from the Chief Financial Officer regarding the Sale of Bond Anticipation Notes.

Best Practices Inventory: Ms. Lapp advised that the Best Practices Inventory was required to be discussed at a Township meeting. It is a 50 question survey requested by the Division of Local Government Services. We answered 47 out of the 50 questions on the survey and no state aid will be withheld. Some of the questions included how our budget was developed and our Shared Services with other municipalities.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MANCHESTER, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE

Mr. Wallis asked Council if they had any comments on the above ordinance. Seeing no comments from Council, Mr. Wallis opened this portion of the meeting to the public.

<u>Thomas McHugh – Accurate Towing:</u> Mr. McHugh was shocked at the increase in the application fee. Raising the fee to \$2500.00 cannot be justified by being on the towing rotation for a one week

every two months. He suggested limiting the amount of towers. Mr. Secare advised that according to the law, you cannot limit the number of towers, but you can limit them to response time. Council advised that they would like the Police to make other recommendations regarding this issue and to carry this ordinance to a date certain.

Seeing no further comments from the public, Mr. Wallis closed this portion of the meeting.

The above ordinance was carried to November 25, 2013 upon a motion by Mr. Fusaro seconded by Mr. Frattini and **approved** by the following roll call vote; Councilmen: Frattini, Weiner, Fusaro and Wallis; yea.

Mr. Wallis explained that the land is an undeveloped area. It is a 40 x 100 lot. Mr. Fusaro said the land is located in a triangle near Route 70 that is owned by the Township. This could be a significant piece of commercial property and could be profitable for the Township if it is developed.

The above ordinance was offered upon a motion by Mr. Weiner seconded by Mr. Frattini and **adopted** by the following roll call vote; Councilmen: Frattini, Weiner, Fusaro and Wallis; yea.

Township Auditor Andrew Zabiega of Samuel Klein and Company commented on this resolution. The State of New Jersey has mandated that all municipalities revert to a calendar year budget. This audit was for the TY 2012 and the Township is now on a calendar year budget. There was only one recommendation for the Court. All utilities are healthy and are self liquidating.
