MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP MEETING MINUTES OCTOBER 21, 2013

The meeting of the Manchester Township Council was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Council President Craig Wallis. The following statement was read by the Municipal Clerk:

"Adequate notice of this meeting was provided in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, pursuant to P.L. 1975, Chapter 231. Said notice was advertised in the Asbury Park Press, Star Ledger and was posted in the lobby of the Municipal Building."

<u>PROCLAMATION</u> – The Clerk read a proclamation into the record proclaiming November 2013 as "National Caregivers Month".

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> The regular minutes of September 23, 2013 were offered upon a motion by Mr. Vaccaro, seconded by Mr. Weiner and **approved** by the following roll call vote; Councilmen: Frattini, Vaccaro, Weiner and Wallis; yea. Mr. Fusaro abstained.

SUBMISSION OF BILLS:

Mr. Wallis asked Council if they had any comments on the above ordinance. Mr. Wallis said this ordinance should be defeated and will be reintroduced as Ordinance #13-010 as there are some minor changes. Seeing no further comments from Council, Mr. Wallis opened this portion of the meeting to the public.

Seeing no comments from the public, Mr. Wallis closed this portion of the meeting.

The above ordinance was offered upon a motion by Mr. Fusaro seconded by Mr. Vaccaro and **defeated** by the following roll call vote; Councilmen: Frattini, Vaccaro, Weiner, Fusaro and Wallis; yea.

#13-009 AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MANCHESTER, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP TO BECOME AN ENERGY AGGREGATOR

Mr. Wallis asked if Council had any comments on the above ordinance.

Mr. Frattini felt that the energy aggregation companies were just out to make money. He did not feel that the government should be involved in this and it was the resident's choice to make the decision regarding their energy provider. Mr. Frattini felt the question should be put on the ballot to find out what the residents want.

Mr. Weiner respectfully disagreed with Mr. Frattini had to say. He felt it was a disservice to residents if Council did not do the research to decide if this is the right thing to do. If Council decides to do this, it may save residents fifteen percent on their electric bills. It will not cost the Township anything to look into this.

Mr. Frattini said all savings is hypothetical. He did not feel it was worth going into something that was not definitive.

Mr. Fusaro said all the numbers are hard numbers because the Township is not under contract but the savings would be between fifteen to eighteen percent. Residents are not required to join the energy aggregation. They can opt out. Mr. Fusaro said a bulk buy of electric would be cheaper. He felt it would be wrong of Council to ignore the potential. Mr. Fusaro said he was willing to go out to the villages to explain the program.

Mr. Wallis felt that Mr. Weiner's intentions are good. He just wants residents to save money. However, Mr. Wallis did not feel that residents should have to "opt-out."

Seeing no further comments from Council, Mr. Wallis opended this portion of the meeting to the public.

Mr. Mathias – LVW: Mr. Mathias disagrees with the "opt-out" clause.

Rita Ellerd – **LVW**: Ms. Ellerd felt that this program would not be worth the savings because the savings was only on the generation fee.

Beverly Cadonzi – **LVW**: Ms. Cadonzi suggested that Manchester Township should be a test case. If the Township saves money on its electric bill than we can offer it to the residents.

Elaine Baumeister – LVW: Ms. Baumeister felt that Council is missing the point. She felt it was not a role for government.

Celeste Boccini – LVW: Ms. Boccini was worried that there would not be a budget option.

Pat Masterson – **LVW**: Ms. Masterson suggested putting this topic aside until we see how neighboring towns do.

Walter Dyluski – **LVW**: Mr. Dyluski felt that Council was overstepping their bounds. He suggested looking at cutting items in the budget to save money.

Carol Deluccia – **Parkview Blvd**.: Ms. Deluccia felt that we should not trust government to make decisions for us. She felt our freedoms were being taken away.

Norm Rosenberg – **LVW**: Mr. Rosenberg felt that we should be able to "opt-in" to the program. Mr. Wallis explained that it was a state law that states it has to be an "opt-out" clause.

Fred Lund – **LVW**: Mr. Lund read a prepared statement. He felt that energy aggregation is complex and convoluted and should not be passed before exposing residents to the mountain of minute details in the program.

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Phil Carr – Good Energy: Mr. Carr said energy aggregation represents another choice and could give residents better buying power.

Ernie Mathias – LVW: Mr. Mathias did not feel JCP&L would want to loose customers on the supply side.

Beverly Kraft – LVW: Ms. Kraft asked for clarification on JCP&L's roll in this situation.

Pat Masterson – **LVW**: Ms. Masterson was concerned that JCP&L could still raise rates on the delivery side.

Celeste Boccini LVW: Ms. Boccini was concerned with who would generate her electric bill if only the supplier would be changed. She also asked if discounts would given for using electric during non peak hours. Mr. Carr of Good Energy said that JCP&L would still be providing your bill and discounts would not be given during non-peak hours.

Elaine Baumeister – LVW: Ms. Baumeister asked if the fee of the engery aggregation company would be inbedded in the per kilowatt hour charge. Mr. Carr advised that it was.

Beverly Cadonzi – LVW: Ms. Cadonzi asked Mr. Carr where Good Energy was located. Mr. Carr advised that they were out of New York.

Sue Bailey – **LVW**: Ms. Bailey asked if this would have an effect on commercial businesses. Mr. Carr advised that commercial businesses have different energy rates.

Walter Dyluski – LVW: Mr. Dyluski asked what Plumsted's rate was under the energy aggregation. Mr. Carr advised it was 8.5 cents per kilowatt hour.

Beverly Cadunzi – **LVW**: Ms. Cadonzi asked if the municipal buildings would be covered under the energy aggregation. Mr. Carr advised it was residential only.

Pat Masterson – **LVW**: Ms. Masterson advised that she wanted the choice to pick her own electric provider.

Ken Palmer – 101 Conrad Ct.: Mr. Palmer asked for specifics on the energy aggregation process.

Mr. Frattini felt that seniors would not know how to "opt-out". Mr. Carr said if his company was chosen, they would make a commitment to go out to the senior communities to explain the process.

Marge Camposano – **Whiting**: Ms. Camposano does not think it is Council's place to worry about electric costs. They should worry about property tax.

Virginia Martin – Renaissance: Ms. Martin felt that Council should worry about property taxes.

Sandy Kaufmann – **LVW**: Mr. Kaufmann said that he would not vote for whomever votes for energy aggregation in the next election.

Mr. Hensel asked Mr. Carr to remind everyone of the "opt-out" process. He also asked if energy aggregation was regulated by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities. Mr. Carr said that it is.

Mr. Fusaro asked Mr. Carr if any Illinois municipalities rejected energy aggregation after the first year. Mr. Carr responded that all 107 communities in Illinois re-signed.

Pat Masterson – **LVW**: Ms. Masterson asked where Mr. Weiner got his research from. Mr. Weiner responded that he did a significant amount of research on the internet as well as speaking with various legislators, energy aggregation companies and neighboring municipalities.

Walter Dyluski – LVW: Mr. Dyluski asked what the new rate would be. Mr. Carr said that it was roughly 8.5 percent.

Seeing no further comments from Council, Mr. Wallis closed this portion of the meeting.
